

## Controversies: DIC Corporation

- In August 2019, [a fire broke out in a factory](#) in Ina, Japan. No casualties or injuries were reported.
- In September 2018, [an explosion occurred at a factory](#) in Kamisu, Japan that killed one employee and injured another. The accident happened during welding work in an outdoor tank.
- In October 2017, [Sun Chemical, a subsidiary of DIC Corporation, was sued](#) over New Jersey contamination, risking shoulder costs of roughly 7.5 million USD.
- In January 2017, [a fire broke out at a factory in Cincinnati, Ohio](#). The factory was operated by Sun Chemical, a subsidiary of DIC Corporation. No one was hurt, but damages are estimated around 75,000 USD.
- In June 2013, Sun Chemical, a subsidiary of DIC Corporation, agreed to pay [65,631 USD in civil penalties](#) for a 1,400 pound leak of anhydrous ammonia vapor at Engelston Township, Michigan.
- In October 2012, [an acid leak was reported](#) at a plant in Engelston Township, Michigan. The local emergency services said no one was endangered during the leak. The plant was operated by Sun Chemical, a subsidiary of DIC Corporation.
- In October 2012, [an explosion at an ink plant in East Rutherford](#), New Jersey injured seven workers. Sun Chemical, a subsidiary of DIC Corporation, that operated the plant informed that two of the workers suffered from severe burns.
- Between 2011 and 2020, DIC Corporation paid [close to 140,000 USD in fines for six environmental violations](#), according to the violation tracker project of Good Jobs First.
