

## **Controversies Umicore**

- In October 2020, after reports of high levels of lead in children's blood, Umicore offers to buy houses surrounding its facility in Antwerp, Belgium.
- In Mars 2020, a fire was reported at Umicore's facility in Antwerp, Belgium. No casualties or injuries were reported.
- In July 2019, a fire was reported at Umicore's facility in Antwerp, Belgium. No casualties or injuries were reported.
- In September 2018, a man was reported killed after an explosion at Umicore Specialty Chemicals in Arab, Alabama.
- In September 2018, a fire was reported at Umicore's Hoboken facility in Antwerp. No casualties or injuries were reported.
- In July 2018, the prefect of the Gard, France initiated a formal notice procedure aimed at
  forcing Umicore to confine five former mining sites at Saint-Félix de Pallières and Thoiras.
  A study from Public Health France released earlier that month had shown high body
  burden of arsenic and cadmium among the population around the mines in comparison
  to the general population.
- In January 2014, two workers repairing a tank at Umicore in Olen, Antwerp province, were killed when the tank containing residue of hydrochloric acid exploded. The investigation into the accident indicated that an unexpected accumulation of cobalt metal led to a build-up of hydrogen in a storage tank. The tank then exploded during maintenance work, without the two employees involved having made any mistakes.
- Between 2011 and 2020, Umicore paid 70,000 USD in fines for one environmental violation, according to the violation tracker project of Good Jobs First.
