

Controversies: Hanwha Solutions

- In April 2022, Hanwha Q Cells USA was [fined \\$56,557 for violations](#) by the Department of Labor.
- In February 2022, [a fatal explosion occurred at a plant](#) run by Yeochun NCC, killing four workers and injuring four others. The incident took place during a test of the heat exchange system. In November 2022, it was announced that the company would be split up between the two owners, Hanwha and DL, as they concluded it would be safer and more efficient to control the plants separately.
- In May 2019, [a massive oil mist leaked](#) from a Hanwha Total Petrochemical factory in Seosan, South Korea, causing at least 327 people to be treated for dizziness and vomiting.
- In April 2019, Hanwha Solutions and a series of other chemical producers [were caught fabricating test results](#) on levels of substances causing fine dust pollution. Through the fabricated test results the company has avoided fines on emissions of sulphur oxides.
- In February 2019, [an explosion at a Hanwha Solutions munitions factory](#) in Daejeon, South Korea killed three people. The factory conducts specializes in fuelling rockets, torpedoes, and other military ordinances.
- In May 2018, [an explosion at a Hanwha Solutions munitions factory](#) in Daejeon, South Korea started a fire that killed two people and wounded five. The explosion appears to have occurred while solid fuel was put into a rocket's propellant container.
- Between 2018 and 2022, [Hanwa Solutions was not fined for any environmental violations](#), according to the violation tracker project of Good Jobs First.
